While at Joe's house, I marveled at not only his "facility" and how comfortable it stayed without A/C, but also his extensive car collection. at Alfa Registration. After discovering they scheduled me for the 1:00 PM restoration shop tour, I was off to Troy, MI, about 20 minutes away. During the tour I was amazed at how these "artisans" (many of them relatively young) can restore vehicles with missing

parts and very poor condition. A few of the cars they were currently working on were one-of-a-kind examples. Some of the cars displayed in their "showroom" I saw again at Sunday's Meadow Brook Concours. After the restoration tour I made a "dash" out to Waterford Hills for the time trials and arrived as the track activities were winding down. I was able to see John Hoard in his GTA Jr. and if I remember the results correctly, he was awarded first place for his efforts. Later that evening, after the Welcome Reception, most of us retired to the parking lot for the proverbial "midnight" Alfa Concours. On any

given night during the convention there was likely a 100 Alfas or more in the hotel's parking lot.



Friday was full of events, including the Autocross, two Tech Sessions and the Downtown Detroit Tour. I concentrated my efforts on cleaning my "Maratona" for the Saturday AROC Concours and attending the Downtown Tour. I was able to attend a small portion of the

Wes Ingram & Joe Benson Tech Session. Most interesting for me were the photos and discussion about the AutoDelta Spica fuel injection systems for the T33 Alfas, very rare "birds" indeed. Also, I understand the Alfa Quilting Workshop was a big success, with "raves" of great fun from those attending. The Downtown Tour was great fun also and included a river cruise along both sides of the St Clair River (Canadian and US), as well as a walk along the riverfront and through the lobby of GM's corporate offices (formerly the Renaissance Center). The Tour

culminated at the Guardian Building, a beautifully restored multi-story Art Deco style building.

Saturday morning, almost everyone gathered at Meadow Brook for the AROC Concours and for me, it was truly Alfa overload. Of the limited number of Conventions that I have attended, this was by far the best gathering of Alfas I have ever seen. I believe every decade of Alfa from the mid 1920s to the present was represented. Besides the three B.A.T. cars there were at (alone worth the trip), least three 1930s vintage Alfas, including a 1931



1750 Zagatto, a 2300 Spider, 1900s, Giuliettas, Giulias, GTVs, GTAs, Montreals, etc., etc. Unfortunately, the half day event was nowhere near enough time to adequately look at them all and take pictures. Saturday evening the Annual Banquet was held and David E. Davis was the guest speaker. The highlight of the banquet for me was acknowledgement of 25 years as an AROC member for Linda and me, as well as the 50 year membership recognition of Ken Askew (the true definition of an Alfaholic).

Sunday began with the Awards Brunch where we learned the results of the Time Trials, Auto Cross, Art Show, Gimmick Rally, and AROC Concours. Many of the


