The Alfa Romeo 105/115 series coupes just look right. They have the right proportions. They have the right stance. They have right amount of everything. They look, feel, sound, and drive like a perfectly balanced machine. These are one of those cars that everyone usually speaks of with fondness in their voice. They make you want to enjoy vintage motoring. They are alluring vehicles and truly one of those "gateway drugs" into the world of classic car collecting.

This Alfa Romeo was built new in August of 1973 and was specifically designated for the California market. It is believed that this GTV has always been a California car. There have been mostly 2-owners from new. Although not much is known about the first owner, he sold it to the second owner in 1985. This owner lived in Northern California. He drove the car for about 5-years before he started a light restoration. He repainted the car in its original color and then did a rebuild on the motor. He never finished the job and ended up storing the car for 25-years in a dry inland warehouse. When the current owner found the car a couple of years ago, it had a set of Webers on the motor, but the conversion had not been completed. The Spica system was complete and included with the car. So, he installed the Spica, tuned it, and the car fired up with the first turn of the key. Furthermore, this owner's Alfa specialist went through the car to get it ready for road use and confirmed that the condition of the engine showed engine showed that it had not many miles on it since being rebuilt.

Further finishing touches to this Alfa include:

New door cards

Dash cover (original dash is cracked)

Replaced windshield and trim with good original parts (rare)

Tuning/service of engine

Lube door hardware

Installed period correct Momo Vega wheels (14x6)

Set of Cromodora wheels included (14x6)

Remove older tint on windows

Installed rare "flying buttress" sport seats (current owner purchased separately)

Finally, a recent compression test was performed and the results were outstanding: 175psi even across all four cylinders (see pic).

The condition of the body and undercarriage is what attracted this owner to this example. It is remarkably dry and straight (see pics). It is clear that not only was this GTV properly stored and cared for, there is a good chance that the miles are probably original as well.

Although the paint is roughly 25+ years old, it hasn't been driven much and mostly stored. As a result, it looks great with minimal signs of use. There is a small chip by the driver door handle (see pic) as well as some minor nicks here and there. The paint was checked with a paint meter on all the panels and there are no signs of filler. All the metal looks to be original and unaltered/undamaged. The paint in the engine bay, trunk, and doorjambs is original. Most of the glass is original except the windshield, which was just replaced with a hard to find example. Some of the trim around the windshield also was replaced with good condition original pieces. The rest of the bright work is original and in great shape. The Momo Vega wheels are in excellent condition with no curb rash and are wearing new Michelin tires. The brake pads and rotors are new all the way around. The driver side door has a later Italian made sport mirror. All the exterior lights work properly.

The interior looks equally as nice. The rare sport seats are in very good condition with no cracks or tears. The headrests work great as does the tilt and slide mechanisms. The door cards are new. The headliner looks fresh with no rips or stains. The dash has a nice cover on it, which fits snug. The original dash is cracked. The carpet appears to be original and is in good condition as well. The shift boot has just been replaced. The e-brake boot is torn and a fresh cover has been installed over it. All the gauge's function properly.

The later installed radio powers on, but there are no speakers connected. This Alfa appears to have dealer installed air-conditioning, which blows and functions, but does not blow cold. The trunk carpet is original and has some stains. Also, the plastic part along the backside of the trunk (covering the rear of the tail lights) is cracked (see pic).

The engine bay looks tidy with original paint and all original factory decals. The fan shroud (see pic) has some broken pieces of plastic, but it operates fine.

This Alfa GTV drives very tight and has excellent throttle response with nice low-range power. It starts easily even when very cold. It holds a steady idle as well. The shifting is smooth and precise with no grinding or other synchro issues. The brakes have a good feel once you apply more pedal. Although the pads, rotors, and tires are new, the system may need to be bled.

California registration is paid through July of 2017.

This Alfa comes with an original owners manual (bit tattered- see pic), original spare wheel with original Michelin tire (see pic), factory jack, and an extra set of fresh Cromodora wheels (seep pics).

Recent Events: Sarasota Road Tour

On Saturday September 24th a group of FAC members drive down to a meeting point just south of the Sunshine bridge to assemble for what turned out to be two days of fun driving out cars and visiting some local Florida sights along the way. Below Harmon Heed provides details of the event. Jordon Tawil provided the following video link as well of our cars:

A Day of Driving Us to Drink

On Saturday, September 24, the club took a terrific road trip; twelve cars and twenty members attended and logged just under 200 miles, mostly in the farm and ranch land in east Manatee County, FL. It was put together by this year's president, Bob Scott.

In attendance were Barry Andress in his 1983 spider veloce, Mark Dubovich in his 2015 Fiat 500L, Delmas & Polly Greene in their Alfa grilled "Aurora," Jeff Hanson in his 1993 spider veloce, Harmon & Jo Heed in their 1964 Giulia spider, Frank Mann in his 1973 BMW 2002, Tony & Mary Kathyrine Paolini in their 1964 Corvette Stingray, John & Cheryl Picot in their 1973 GTV 2000, Ruggero & Carla Santilli in their 2015 Maserati GranTurismo, Bob & Carolyn Scott in their 1987 spider Quadrifoglio and new member Jordan Tawil and his wife, Chelsea, in their 2015 4C Launch and their friends.





The best driving was in the morning, while it was still cool and dry, especially for those in older cars without A/C. (Fall hasn't come to Florida, yet.) The group first met for coffee at a convenient Dairy Queen at an intersection off I-275 just south of the Sunshine Skyway Bridge. At 9:00AM we headed east away from population. Bob coursed us a moderate route to fit the non-Italian attending cars but the Corvette, BMW and the Oldsmobile sedan (driven by the Greenes who own six Alfas – Polly wanted AC) didn't lag one bit.

The route took us on a pastoral loop through small towns most of us had never been to, never heard of and didn't know when we went through: Heart Groves, Duette and into Bunker Hill. Our first destination was the small Bunker Hill Winery where we were greeted and given an educational presentation by the owners Larry & Lenora Woodham.





It's a very unique winery in that all of its Muscatine grapes (Florida's only grape) are all grown in their vineyards and all of the fifteen fruits used in their fruit wines are fresh, locally and organically grown. The sugar sometimes added for fermentation, especially when making tea wine, is only Florida cane sugar which has no GMOs. Some of their other, unique wines are Banana, Sweet Yellow Onion, Papaya, Red Grapefruit, Sweet Potato, Spiced Pumpkin, Cherry Tomato, T-Mango and three different limes. They are often offered medium or dry. Lenora poured tastings of six of the wines. She and Larry bottle about 68,000 bottles of wine annually. The alcohol content of every bottle is 13% and, uniquely, the price of every bottle is \$13.



The winery is also unique because of its recycling program. All of the fruit residuals are used as fertilizer. It is the only Florida winery that uses recycled bottles and its current recycled bottle total 62,280. The club members didn't buy quite that many bottles of wine that day.

After the winery the group headed into the hinterland of Hardee County, through Ft. Green (never heard of that place and didn't see it when we drove through, either) to the five star Streamsong Resort.



The ultramodern resort was built by Mosaic right in middle of its Phosphate mining wasteland. The golf course sand tailings (what's left after the potash is removed) looks like the world's largest sand trap. The cars were parked right in front of the club house and lunch was served in a private room overlooking the starting point and practice green. Great service and great advance planning, Bob!

Then the group headed back west, nonstop, all the way to Sarasota with cool down showers on the way. (Most of the spiders put their tops up.) Bob had timed a tour at the Drum Circle Distillery that produces Siesta Key Rum.



When the group arrived the tour was started by the founder and CEO, Troy Roberts, who modestly yet proudly mentioned many prestigious awards the young distillery's rum has garnered. Then Kevin, the production distiller showed us step by step how the rum is processed from molasses in giant, stainless steel stirring vats, distilled in a copper still and aged in oak barrels. And what gives the spiced rums their flavors.





The distillery is small, family owned and run, and produces about 2,000 bottles a week on a four-week cycle. Probably the most popular is the coconut spiced rum priced, as most are, at \$25. The premium, Gold, is aged four years and is priced at \$45. As always, the tour ended in the tasting room and many members took home many more bottles.

After the tasting some members headed home and others checked into a hotel Bob had arranged a discount rate. The day was capped off by dinner at a very nice and nearby Italian restaurant, Wheat & Water. There the group toasted Bob for planning, organizing and directing a drive on scenic, country roads with stops at unique places like a fruit winery, five-star resort and fine rum distillery!







Car has lots of upgrades. Suspension is all racing spec. Very tightly tuned and handles like a true Rear Wheel Drive Italian sports car with racing bloodline. Car has been gone over inside and out. Will not find another one that has been gone through to this extent. Does have some quirks as most Alfas do. Just like most Italian women, the cars also require more maintenance then average.


