Restoration Projects: #1 Mike Vianni's 1958 Sprint

Phase One: Car's original Condition: As it arrived

Phase One: Car's original Condition:

Body Panels look good but can be deceiving – The tin worm can lurk underneath



The suspension looks rough and the engine arrived in pieces along with boxes filled with other parts.

The interior is complete but need work too.







Needs a new headliner for sure.

All that old paint has to go.

Just back from media blasting – Lots to do!



Phase Two: Stripping the Body and Looking for Surprises beyond the obvious ones

Rust repairs begin that were hidden by the paint.

More rust repair and panel replacement



Cut out the rust and weld in new steel where needed. New floor pans welded in.



Grind those welds down and smooth out those lines. This is the hard part but almost done.



Phase Three: Body Prep and Paint

Final grinding of the welds and sanding smooth. Epoxy primer coat and blocking



Fresh paint makes a big difference

New Blue Paint from the rear based on the original



Interior is sealed and coated

Engine Bay and Trunk painted body color

Restoration Projects: #2 My 1974 GTV

I found this 1974 GTV in California - a race car project that the owner had died and friends of the wife were helping her sell it. The previous owner had done a lot of work and bought lots of parts and spares which came along with the car. Initially it looked pretty good in its red paint, but time and some stripping would uncover some issues and rust that needed repair and or replace.

I insisted that every inch of old paint come off even underneath which was a lot harder to remove but worth it. Had I known how long this would take and the various ups and downs to this story that I would ultimately endure – well hind sight is always 20/20. The plan was to make this 74 GTV look like a 69 GTV with some subtle outward appearance mods, but lots of performance lurking underneath.

Phase One:

Here is the rear end torn apart prior to new seals and bearings.



The process of stripping all the old paint has begun.

A few surprises were lurking under that red paint



Phase One continues:

Off comes the old paint and reveals some surprises. Multiple layers of old paint reveal a decent body.



We kept finding more areas in need of repair. This is why you completely strip the body to bare metal.



Both door skins were replaced as well as the right-side rocker panel. More rust repairs around glass.



Phase Two: Making Repairs and Prepping the Body

Rust lurking around all the glass surfaces that needed repair – remove old filler & brass repairs too.



Custom mounting for new Griffin Radiator and integral oil cooler as well as new fuel cell.



Primer coat – see the new smaller tail lights. The side markers and fuel door have been shaved smooth.



Phase Three: New Platinum Paint Blocked Twice with Multiple Clear Coats

Here it is in its final Platinum Silver Paint that really shows off the bodies Lines. It is stunning in the sun.
