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President's Column

Has anyone heard of the "Alfa Rescue Society"? Its name came up, not in a positive way, from a former NWARC member, Tom, who was in the process of rescuing a 1973 GTV. That's a good story in itself. The first time he called, he had been to the memorial service of another car enthusiast and just happened to stop at a garage sale on his way home. There, was a Piper Yellow 1973 GTV, original and complete, with a great interior and 66,000 miles. It needed some bodywork, but the seller was just the second owner and he had the original window sticker and complete service records. It was fun for Tom to see the window sticker and some early invoices from Grand Prix Motors, when they were still in Leschi. Later invoices, up to the 60,000 mile service in 1977, were from Alfa of Tacoma. The car had been parked since 1979. Sounds like a car worth saving, right?

During Tom's consideration of whether to buy it, and who to contact, he called me. I gave him some names, and at our club meeting a couple of days later, mentioned the car and its background. Soon after that, he got a call from someone who said they were "The Alfa Rescue Society". Was there a possible connection here? We don't know, as I did not give anyone his phone number and only a couple of people even knew Tom's name. I hope there was not a connection as the conversation was not very positive and they offered Tom \$500 for the car. Further conversation led to an offer of \$1,000 and the disclosure that they were going to "cut it up for parts". That obviously was not the proper fate for an Alfa of this condition, with the history it had. So Tom went through a few selling options, and ended up putting it on a Bring-a-Trailer auction. One reason I hadn't done that when I was selling the Giulietta was the discussion that ensues and the possibility of negative comments. He certainly got some, including some early ones from "The Alfa Rescue Society" that were pretty snarky. Their statements included that it was probably not worth saving, would empty a bank account and other negative assertions. At one point, another commenter asked them, "Do you want to rescue Alfas or not?"

I was correct about BAT auctions and negative comments. I can't believe how vituperative some people are. They hadn't even seen the car but had so

many nasty things to say. They had a lot of things to say to and about each other, too. Fortunately, there were a lot of people who were more positive, including a possible buyer from Michigan who happened to be in town and actually went to see the car. The listing included about 70 pictures so I don't think there were any secrets and after 135 comments and 18 bids, the car sold for \$7,000. The under bidder was the Michigan visitor and the winner is from the San Francisco Bay area. He plans to restore it, with some nice modifications, to make it a California Mille car. It all turned out well, but I still wonder who "The Alfa Rescue Society" is and what their aspirations are. Comments are still being posted, as I write this, four days after the end of the auction. 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Alfa Romeo News... Putting the NEWS in Newsletter



Our 2017 AROC National Convention is in Montreal celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the stunning Gandini designed, V8 powered, Alfa Romeo Montreal that was rolled out to the world at the Expo '67 and named after the host city. The car had unique style and features that won over almost everyone who saw it. We did have to wait a few years for production cars but from 1970 through 1977, these were sold to the world. This fun image is only a **design study from Auto Italia** magazine for the sake of seeing a modernized concept based on an Alfa 8c... we have a couple base cars for this in our club. Volunteers?

Known for hosting one of the most beautiful Concours d'Elegance in the world, the Villa d'Este in Tivoli Italy

is stunning. Built in 1550 on the banks of the Aniene River, all cars seem more beautiful with the backdrop of Baroque design, 100 fountains, gardens, and the sparkling waters. Its such an exquisite site that UNESCO long ago gave it **World Heritage Site status**. Now, as part of this year's Concours d'Elegance, for the first time, UNESCO has awarded World Cultural Heritage status to a car. The Alfa Romeo SZ Coda Tronca Prototipo Zagato designed by Ercole Spada. Cleaned and preserved by a unique team of Italian restorers using techniques usually applied to ancient paintings and sculptures, it was treated like a Renaissance painting. The car was displayed half "untouched" and half cleaned, so people could best understand how these techniques can preserve the beauty and pureness of the object.

The only constant is change... The car guy

running Alfa Romeo and Maserati has been Harald Wester for the last 5 years... the longest he's ever held a position. Now, the former head of RAM Trucks and US Marketing for Alfa Romeo, 41 year old **Reid Bigland** takes over those two brands. Reid was born just north of most of us, in Kamloops, British Columbia. He has a lot of truck experience, and little Alfa seat time. I wanted to judge him by the fact that his first car was a '76 Impala, but I guess I owned an Austin Mini as my first car so I can't be trusted. Tragically, he's best know for referring to Chrysler car sales as "moving faster than chickenpox through



kindergarten". I guess we'll see how it goes. I would have voted for Ralph Gilles, current FCA Head of Design... a known Alfa owner and good car nut.

On May 14, COYS Auctions put up a stunning, and extremely accurate **Alfa Romeo 33 Stradale** for sale. Of the 19 made, only 18 ever ended up in home garages so these are rare at auction. What made this one different was it was called a **"continuation"** car, like the Aston Martin DB4 Zagato cars, or Jaguar E-Type lightweight cars. The key difference is those Continuation cars were commissioned or built by the original factory. This was a private person who bought leftover parts from Autodelta; the builder of the original 33 Stradales. The builder fabricated the body and interior, and found many pieces of the drivetrain. It was sold without a complete engine but did have a proper crank, heads, and transmission. (A V8 from a Montreal would be a close working engine.) In my eyes, it would be a beautiful full scale model of a collectable car that would grace anyone's garage nicely, awaiting the sad day when its value would be increased by pulling the parts out for a restoration project on another, real 33 Stradale. No word if it sold or for how much.

2016 Half Fast Lap of Washington

After lunch, we wander through the beautiful North Cascades Scenic Highway, Rockport, Darrington, Arlington, and back into the Seattle area. The roads this day will be very good.

In all, it should be about 900 miles so plan accordingly. Many wonderful roads and a good chance to stretch the cars legs.

Mille Miglia 2016 (May 19-22)

Just like it happened back in 1930, the Alfa Romeo 6C1750 Gran Sport won the Mille Miglia in Italy in 2016. Back in the day, it was driven by Tazio Nuvolari and Battista Guidotti. In fact, in 1930, Nuvolari found himself trailing his teammate, Achille Varzi as they headed north towards the finish line in Brescia. Nuvolari switched off his headlights, even though he was driving over 90 MPH in the dark. Varzi couldn't see any headlights in his mirror, but when it was too late, Nuvolari turned the lights back on, made the pass and won the race. (He would have won either way as his overall elapsed time was less.)

This year, the winning car was driven, a lot slower and with less daring stunts, by two people from Brescia; Andrea Vesco and Andrea Guerini. They were 1 of 46 total Alfas competing in this year's event... the most plentiful margue in the event.

This year, like most, provided sunshine, darkness, crowds, cool roads, good scenery, and rain to give the participants a perfect mix of all that is Italy in May, and what the Mille really is all about.
