It also meant that traction and braking limits would occur

at a much lower and controlled speed.

The group of students that showed up ranged from teenagers to several gray hairs like me. Cars went from standard daily drivers and a Jeep, up to high end Porsches,

We enjoy drives on New Year's Day, summer, and our annual Half Lap. Often, we have informative tech sessions with mechanics or subject matter experts who teach us about repair tasks, upgrade ideas, and detailing. If you enjoy driving fast, our track events are wonderful options to learn to enjoy your car(s) at speed. A few members have gone on to race in many events outside of club track days. Additionally, our club meetings have had entertaining visits where members share travels and special events.

These are just some of the many examples of the great benefits of sharing our Alfa Romeo enthusiasm between members. Our enthusiasm often extends to our supportive families and friends. Outside of the club, many people benefit from our efforts, enjoyment and generosity through our club's philanthropic side. Our club has been generous for many years, but today I'm highlighting the wonderful gifts we've shared over the last couple years.

Back in March of 2015, we had a tour of three local car collections and charged a minimal fee from attendees. The \$742 profits were split equally between two local benefactors.

First, we donated to The Village Theater in Issaquah. Arts are a wonderful benefit to a community and the Village Theater has been one of these benefits since they opened in 1979 in Issaquah. This live theater has worked dilgently since the beginning to develop all facets of theater skills from lighting, direction, and of course... acting and singing. Over the years, in excess of 150 productions have originated at The Village Theater with many going on to garner national recognition. Just like NWARC, they are small and local with a wonderful national reputation.

Next, Seattle Children's Hospital received our check. This renowned local hospital is one of the top five pediatric hospitals in the country. Seattle Children's provides necessary medical care to all children in our region, regardless of a family's ability to pay. They also have a wonderful track record of helping the whole family during what can often be a very tough and scary time while a child needs medical care. A very worthy recipient of our gifts.

As a club we agreed to donate our profits from our 2015 Holiday party to two charities as well. Our profits came from our wonderful sponsors who send us gift items as well as members who donate and / or purchase from the auction tables. We split the profits equally with the first half going to Seattle Children's Hospital through the SOVREN Guild. Over the years, this guild has been partnering with the local vintage car racing scene and raised over \$9 million towards



the uncompensated care provided to all families who need it since 1991. We added our check for another \$1,450 to their wonderful cause.

The remainder of the 2015 money went to another Seattle group that helps families in need; the Seattle Milk Fund. Originally started over 110 years ago to provide fruits, vegetables and flowers to hospital patients in Seattle, then getting its name from helping families during the depression while working through a milk dispensary. Today, they still focus on families, utilizing 200 volunteers to provide family support and child care as needed.

Another gift we are working on is to create an annual scholarship with the Lake Washington Technical Institute. Ken Case and I met with their fundraising guild to gather details and discuss our club's commitments. We still have a few details to finalize, but this will become an annual plan. With many of the public schools dropping their shop and automotive classes, skills to repair and maintain cars is becoming more challenging to find. Our focus is to support this specialized school and students by providing money that can pay for tuition or tools as needed. We'll share more on this as we finalize the gift and when it's renewed annually. The money for this comes from any surplus from our track days or skills schools.

It's a joy knowing that our passions for Alfa Romeo, friendships within the club and efforts to put these events together can pay back to members of the society we all live in. Additionally personal for me is the fact that as a young poor kid growing up in Seattle in the 60's my family was a recipient of generosity of the Seattle Milk Fund. I know that many of us or our families have been touched by these great organizations already, or may in the future. One way or another, we all benefit when we share like we do. Remember all the good that comes from your efforts when you volunteer your efforts or join one of these fun club events. Thanks for your help in making this such a wonderful club. — *Fred*

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## Tulip Rallye Tips – Wild About Cars Garage, 14 Mar 2017

Learning from the Rally Master

Our March Club meeting was held at Wild About Cars Garage on March 14, attended by 19 stalwarts. As usual, WAC had a fascinating variety of vehicles



on display. How often do you see two De-Loreans in one place? Or a 1937 Packard sandwiched between a Mercedes SLR McLaren on one side and a pink VW Microbus pickup on the other? And it's amazing how small a Jaguar E-Type looks when parked alongside a 1953 Cadillac convertible!

Following the usual socializing, dinner and short club meeting, our speaker, Bert Cripe, proceeded to pass on to us the bene



Cripe, proceeded to pass on to us the benefit of his years of experience in planning the annual MG Car Club's Tulip Rallye. This highly popular event is always a fun drive through the countryside of the Skagit Valley while trying

to answer a long series of obscure and humorous questions about things seen along the route. A plaque is awarded to the winner from each car club that has five or more members taking part. I'm not saying that our

members aren't normally competitive, but our esteemed President and Secretary have a particularly long-standing rivalry over winning this event.

This year we tried to level the playing field a bit by asking Bert to outline how he goes about setting up the rally, and how that might give the rest of us our best chance of winning that coveted plaque.

First of all, Bert tries to make sure the route instructions are as clear and unambiguous as possible, with no traps or gimmicks. The important thing is that participants be able to get where they're supposed to be safely and with the minimum of distractions. Routes are checked on Google



Earth to determine the placement and visibility of road signs, and are physically driven multiple times to verify any changes.

That said, his goal is definitely to challenge each team sufficiently to make sure that not everyone gets all the answers correct! The following tips may help:

- The rally always uses at least two sets of instructions outlining the route in different orders. This discourages drivers from blindly following the car in front, and reduces the traffic impact on residential and crowded neighborhoods.
- The clues generally take a humorous approach which requires some creative thinking to answer. While all clues are given

in order along the route and every answer will be visible from the car, you will have to look around. If an instruction says to "Turn Right at the Stop Sign" and is followed by a clue, the answer will be within view at some point after you've made the turn and before you get to the next instruction. But it may also be behind you immediately after you've turned...

- As soon as you receive your route instructions and rally questions at starting point, pull over and read them. There is almost always at least one question that can only be answered by looking around close to the starting line, and it's very easy to overlook these.
- It's also worth looking through the whole list of questions right then in case there's anything you should be
  noting along the way, such as "How many times did you cross a waterway during the rally?" And if one of
  the questions is something like "How many times are railroad crossings mentioned in the instructions?",
  that will include the mention in the question!
- Don't just follow another car; they may be on a different route. Make a point of crossing off each route instruction as you perform it. That way, if you do get lost and have to call the organizers on your cell phone, they'll have a chance of working out where you went wrong and how to help you.
- While this is a fun event with the opportunity to stop along the way and take photographs (maybe even of tulips), in the event of a tie in the rally question scores your elapsed time and/or mileage will be used as tie-breakers. Any pressure will be purely self-imposed, so find your own balance and have a good time either way! Article and photos: Jon Inge .
